Key Achievements for the Year 2020

- 1,565 trauma survivors and their immediate family members provided with Psychosocial Support
- Livelihood support provided to 90 former-clients through the NTT programme
- Opening of FRC center in Monaragala in May 2019, and subsequent service provision to 38 clients
- Revision and implementation of Client Intake Form (CIF) with the support of The Asia Foundation
- FRC branching out to provide psychosocial services for survivors of human trafficking through the IOM funded programme
- Receiving an invitation from the Directorate of Mental Health to present at the Mental Health Review of 2019
- Contributing for the recruitment of Family Support Officers for the OMP by the FRC's Clinical Psychologist, and discussions about possibilities of FRC providing Clinical Supervision

Key Results in 2020 in relation to Rehabilitation

- 1,502 trauma survivors and their immediate family members provided with 11,867 counselling, 1,992 medical and 1,540 physiotherapy sessions
- 401 (26%) referrals to other services were done, with 65% clients' having their requests being met
- Development, translation and printing of Community Volunteer (CV) manual and dissemination to FRC's CVs in the 09 centers
- Identification and capacitation of 117 Champion Mobilisers to conduct social change projects within their villages







• FRC conducted a series of webinars focusing on psychosocial and emergency responses during COVID-19.






